LIBRARY TO CLOSE ON SUNDAYS STARTING IN FALL

Beginning in September, the Library will not reopen on Sundays as it has in

change will become permanent throughout the year.

From the Director

We are in the midst of *Making a Splash* with our summer reading program. Kids, and adults, are reading, playing and learning at the library. But, fall is just around the corner.

Fall will bring one major change but our traditional rules will remain. As announced on page 1, this fall the library will change operating hours, closing on Sundays, to save on staffing and utility costs. We had observed over the last few years that our 3-hour Sunday business is much slower than any other day. This is likely due to patrons doing the bulk of their research on the internet and to patrons' ability to use our catalog, request or renew books and access library databases from their homes.

Meanwhile, on Saturdays, we were chasing people out at our 4 pm closing. We will extend Saturday hours by one, staying open from 10 am to 5 pm, the same hours as Friday. The total hours open will

decrease by two per week or 66 through the year. We will, however, not make any other changes in our operations. Please note that Vienna Public Library is an independent library, with its own Board, staff and financing.

Based on Board policy, we will continue to charge fines, believing that they act as an incentive to return items on time. Our fines are \$.05 per day per book, maximum \$1.00, and \$.50 per day per movie, maximum \$5.00. We also have four fine-free periods during the year.

We are keeping the loan periods the same, being two weeks for books, magazines or audio books (2 renewals) and 3 days for movies (one renewal). The loan period allows for a higher turnover and more uses per item. We continue to add over 350 books, 20 audios and 20 DVDs each month, so there's always something new to watch, listen to or read.
